- 1. These taverns were of "interest to those whose destination lay beyond, and whose needs were of the immediate." Life unfulfilled becomes, for some, a mad rush toward something that will make it worth living; something that will give it purpose. Like the Trail Tavern, some people see their occupation, their relationships, and their station in life only as a place to be while they are looking for that place they would rather be. They never experience peace though it stands before them; continually looking for completeness while it reaches out its hand to them. Refusing the love of their redeemer and looking instead for the acclaim of men.

- 2. When Banyon entered Landra's room to protect her from her guard, she said to him, "your pretty talk will win you no favor with me. You are a sword for hire; your allegiance is bought for a copper. Your soul will perish in this world for lack of love." Banyon was a mercenary who hired himself out to guard, protect, and do battle if necessary. He was good at what he did, but being good at something does not justify any harm that may come as a result. Working for a person or company that is known for being dishonest or immoral damages your reputation and your character. Even if you are not personally involved in the actual wrongdoing. Stay away from gray areas. If you have to convince yourself it is not wrong, it probably is!

3. While Prince Phillip was searching for the proof that Landra was in Castle Richet, he heard many legends "of evil men and heroes of battle; of small men who were great and great men who were small." The greatness of a man is not just measured in stature. His honor, fairness, and loyalty are all measures when it comes to how others consider him. Often people simplify their feelings toward another by stating it in one word.

### WHAT PITFALLS LIE ALONG THE ROAD TO NOTORIETY?

4. King Phillip had Idea-men who invented great things. Although he could have kept these things for his own people, he shared them with other kingdoms. These wonderful new things made the King well thought of throughout the land. "There was not a single King who had not declared a holiday in honoring King Phillip. So common were these new things from the Land of Boochell that anything new and different became known as a 'Boochell.'" As it turned out, the enemy provided these things. It is dangerous for anyone—particularly in a leadership role—to begin to listen to his/her own press; to begin to think of themselves too highly. Many great leaders of the world in politics and religion have come to ruin by succumbing to their belief in their own self-worth!

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# WHAT DO TITLES REALLY MEAN?

- 5. Sire, Sir, King, Prince, Lady, and Queen are titles used throughout this story. Titles are inherited or earned in many different ways. As Sterling, Dutch, and Phillip are climbing up some rocks, Sterling lets us in on his feeling about a particular title. "And another thing, you call me Lord; indeed, I've had enough of men placing titles on other men earned or no. "Sterling" will do just fine." Treating people different because of station, position, or company title can be very wrong. Give respect where it is due, but guard yourself against paying special attention to someone just because they are popular, rich, or politically connected. This is a form of prejudice and when practiced will cause that person, and any who witness it, to lose their respect for you.
  - Although salvation is purely a gift from God, can we earn positions of importance in His service?
  - How are we to respond when given these opportunities to serve?

# WHAT ARE SOME PEOPLE WILLING TO RISK TO BECOME FAMOUS?

- 6. While talking to Phillip, Sterling stated, "a man who feels himself inferior to other men wishes himself revered. In a strange way he often feels he can steal that reverence from another.' Sterling paused. 'When he comes across someone who has a reputation of being strong and valiant, it makes him feel even smaller. So, he risks life itself to steal the glory from the one revered." People are often willing to give up everything to try to gain that which will not last. To covet a person's possessions is easily identified as being wrong. As well as possessions, people also covet another person's position, status, influence, and popularity. God wants to give you the desires of your heart, but only when they are in line with His will. Obedience is the answer to true joy.

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# SHOULD WE LET THE WORLD HAPPEN TO US?

- 7. Landra, in Castle Rischet, recalled her father, King Phillip, often saying, "It's not the chances you get, but the chances you take that make the most difference." Have you ever said to yourself, "I will never get another chance like that?" So often we sit back and wait for opportunities to present themselves. We don't realize that usually the best opportunities are the ones intentionally made. No one owes you good fortune, you must seek it out. If you know the desires of your heart, and want to see them fulfilled, first ask God for guidance and wisdom, and then search for opportunities to accomplish your goals. Always keep within your Christian convictions. Pray and ask God to open your eyes to possibilities, and to never let you lose sight of His perfect will for your life.
  - What kind of chances might a Christian have to take in life to get ahead?
  - What is the danger in not ever taking chances?

Remember if the opportunity "has to be taken now or it will get away," it is most likely not a part of God's perfect will for your life. God is never hurried, so He wouldn't put you in that situation either.

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#### WHY SHOULD WE SHOW RESPECT FOR EVIL?

- 8. When Sterling jokingly accused Dutch of using the black arts to learn about the garrison at Castle Rischet, Dutch chastised him. "Do not speak of things of which you know nothing. Bar your soul that you not be required to learn more than the nothing you know already. The Black house is not to be laughed at. And, the day you accuse me of thus will be the last we are as friends." Sterling immediately apologized to him. Jibing or picking at someone can be a thoughtless act and not meant to offend. But, there is always some thread of truth in every jest.
  - Why is Dutch so sensitive to this innuendo?
  - Are there lessons we should learn about taking evil forces in the world so lightly?

Without doubt "He who is in us is greater than he who is in the world." But to think you, without the power of the Holy Spirit, could accomplish anything in this arena is foolish.

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# HOW SHOULD WE RESPOND WHEN WE LEARN WE HAVE HURT SOMEONE?

9. When Sterling realized his joking had hurt Dutch, he immediately tried to make it right. "My friend, if I have wounded you in any way, I break before you my pride, and beg your forgiveness. I meant no harm, but see I have, in jest, trodden on burdensome ground. I declare with you a lifelong friendship which I will never intentionally break." Never allow a broken relationship have time to fester. Do what is possible on your part to set it right. Friendships are precious and should be counted as treasures. Guard them, cherish them, and nurture them whenever it is needed.

- What was Sterling doing when he crossed the line with Dutch? Can we learn anything from that?
- Do you make opportunities to let your friends know you appreciate their friendship? Why is this hard for some people to do that?

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# CAN WE QUICKLY DISCERN THE CHARACTER OF A NEW ACQUAINTANCE?

10. While being interviewed, the leader of Dutch's cook-pot captives told the group about Banyon and his recent history at Castel Richet. Dutch saw through the man's dislike of his ex-commander and made an observation, "'A man's true worth, like truth itself, lies not in the victory or the vomit, but somewhere in between." It often requires spending much time with a person to learn their true nature and character. However, through the Holy Spirit an attentive Christian can be provided insight and understanding into what motivates another person, and what actions can be expected from them. This is but one of many benefits from walking in the Spirit.

# HOW WILL YOU DIE? AND, HOW MANY TIMES?

11. When Banyon was inflicted with Galorick's red tufted pin, he continually came and went from sleep. Captain Russell commented, "'this is a true curse of the other world. Not just to die, but to die a hundred times before the end." Although Christians may be concerned about how they might die, most are not afraid of death itself. The reason is because we know what happens next. If we truly believe what Jesus said, we can be truly confident in what is to come. If we are saved to eternal life, how might the statement that we should die and die again be true? There is an important concept referred to as "dying to self." Even after we are saved we are in a constant struggle with our evil natures we were born with. But we can have victory over it because of the power of the Holy Spirit

living in us. So by dying to self and that old evil nature daily, we give the Spirit a chance to teach and mature us in the Lord.

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#### MAN CANNOT SERVE EVIL AND GOOD!

- 12. When Phillip first speaks to Banyon and his men, he acknowledges that he knows they once served the evil Dala. He then says to them, "your actions in defense of Princess Landra outweigh all else. And, since you seem to be now without pledge, I offer, in the name of King Stephen of Boochell, all the benefits, the wages, and the residence of the Palace Avorine of the Land of Boochell." It is important that when a person empties him or herself of worldly things that they are filled with something else; as it was with the Elite. They had been committed to an evil service. When they threw off that evilness they needed a new commitment and a new direction in which to serve. Allow the Holy Spirit to fill your thoughts, your time, and your relationships so that when the time comes your battles will be more easily won.
  - Are there things you do that are a part of your evil nature that you know are not a part of your heavenly pledge?
  - How is service to King Jesus like the pledge and service to an earthly King? How is it different?

# HOW DO YOU PREPARE FOR SPIRITUAL BATTLE?

13. When Dutch and Daniel were preparing to help Banyon out of the darkness, they were shown a rocky knoll. Daniel commented that he was not comfortable with the exposure. Dutch said softly, "for what we are about in this place, it matters not that we hide, for it is not with the human eye our presence will be known." If the evil forces in this world lack anything, it is not in the area of intelligence. Since they do not have foreknowledge, they depend on their network of spies. If Spiritual warfare is taking place isn't it likely that forces of evil, as well as heavenly forces, are involved? Nothing good or bad is hidden from the spirit world. Never underestimate nor take for granted their influence on your daily life, good and bad. "But fear not for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world."

- Are the evil forces in the world worried about you? Are you a blip on their radar?
- Our ability to deal with evil in the world, whether spirit or flesh, is based on what power?

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# HOW CAN YOU BECOME WISE?

14. While Daniel and Dutch were preparing to help Banyon, Daniel asked Dutch how he could become wiser. Dutch answered, "Many say, "Wisdom is born of hard work and hardship." But the stories of the Great Light tell of wisdom that is given; that is neither earned nor purchased. They teach that true wisdom is given to those who continually ask for it." Most people think that wisdom is earned by time and experience, but I have known young people who were unusually wise in their decisions, and older people who were still foolish. The Bible says we should desire to be wise, and there is nothing we can do to earn it. Wisdom itself is a gift from God. His wisdom has the ability to see the consequences of our actions before we do. We should pray daily that God will bestow more and more of His wisdom upon us.

# DO YOU FEAR OTHERS KNOWING YOU ARE A CHRISTIAN?

15. After registering the Elite at the games at Queens Field, and returning to the camp, Sterling spoke to the group of soldiers about the competition that would begin the next day. He said, "'Fear not losing the first but never lose the last." Like the competition at Queens Field, when you prepare to share the truth of the Gospel with someone you are actually preparing to battle the enemy. We often become afraid of humiliation or rejection by a friend or acquaintance and take the coward's path of silence. But know this, you may be the only Jesus that person ever meets. It may be totally up to you. Prepare by learning the Word, pray to your Father for wisdom and guidance, then do your best. You will never be disappointed for trying. That is all He asks. Leave the victory to God. He has done great things in and for you. Never allow yourself to be seen as being ashamed of Him.

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# **ARE YOU GENEROUS WITH PRAISE?**

16. A few minutes before Sterling was to compete in the games, an older Captain approached hoping to introduce Sterling to a young protégé who was with him. Sterling recognize him "If you take the time to let this fine warrior teach you what he knows, you will need no other instruction!' Sterling was obviously sincere in his praise. Both the Captain and the young warrior had gotten what they desired, and more." Always be generous with your praise of others. It shows kindness and speaks a lot about who you are and your own confidence. It is said, what people remember most about meeting you is how you made them feel. Never underestimate the importance of that fact, particularly when it comes to your Christian witness. To genuinely point out another's good points or talents is giving a gift that costs you very little, but is of great value to the receiver.

#### HOW DO YOU MEASURE?

17. After Sterling's bout with the Claymore Guard, he and Phillip went back to camp and sat under a tree to talk. In answer to one of Phillip's questions about being able to get whatever he wanted, Sterling said, "Truthfully, I have searched all my life to find what I really want. I have never felt I belonged anywhere and have never amassed any wealth. I have known great men and those memories are beyond value to me, but I cannot say I have had any worthwhile desire, much less achievement." Here was a man who by worldly standards had the respect and acclaim of many, and the fear of more than a few. He should have been able to acquire anything he desired. Yet he still looked for completeness in his life. Men are born with a need to find God. Everything they strive for, or covet, is to fill that place in their heart fit only for a mighty God and loving Savior. True fulfillment and pure joy are found only in service to the One and only.

# ARE LEADERS ALWAYS CHOSEN BY THOSE WHOM THEY LEAD?

18. Sterling and Phillip continued their talk under the tree. Sterling spoke, "Leading men into battle is not the difficult part. Keeping them there and bringing them back shows what kind of leader a man is." A leader must earn the respect of those he expects to follow him. Someone can be placed in authority but he/she must—through careful actions—climb the ladder of admiration with those in their charge. Only after demonstrating leadership qualities will he/she be given loyalty. Sometimes you may be placed in a situation where there are one or many people who are in need of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. But you may have to work and wait over time until you have earned the

right to be heard. When they have watched you over time, and observe how you react in good and bad situations, they will then determine whether you can be trusted and followed.

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#### HOW IS BEING LOST, WELL...BEING LOST?

- 19. When Banyon was describing his time in the darkness he said, "I wandered in my mind, being unable to wake. I was in total darkness, except for a light in the distance. A voice told me to run from the light, and I did until I was told how to find my way....the Light was The Light of the World, the Great Light Himself!" Though the Light is symbolic, but it is also real. The people of the world live out their lives in darkness. They rationalize and justify the things they do by thinking "everyone does it." They say to themselves, "I am no worse than the next guy." Then the Light comes. It may be from a Christian simply living a good life. But the light in a Christian's life shows up the darkness in the man of the world's life. The worldly man has two options: 1) Clean up his own life, or 2) put the light out, and remain in the comfort of darkness. This is why the world fights against Christianity. It is lost in the dark and is ignorant enough to want to stay there.
  - Is God's Light in your life bright enough to be used by someone else to find their way to the Truth?
  - Do you live or work in a dark place that needs the Light of the World? Will you do what God saved you to do?

#### AM I MY BROTHER'S KEEPER? YEP!

20. The morning after Sterling and Banyon had realized they were brothers, Sterling woke and "pondered the previous night's activities, and smiled when he thought of his brother. Banyon, yes Banyon, was his brother. He looked down, smiled, shook his head, and thought to himself: And just the kind of brother a man would want to have, too!" Some families are close, and some are not. It is easy to discard responsibilities we have to our families. This is most often done because we know they know us better than anyone. If anyone is going to throw something up in our faces about our previous life, before Christ, it will be our family. Although this is true, that in no way makes us unaccountable for our brothers, sisters, parents, or our own children. Be the person you need to be to repair hurt feelings and broken relationships. Never think a friendship is beyond rebuilding if in doing so will bring God glory and honor. You think it's too hard? Don't tell me, tell God!

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# WHAT IS THE WORST THING ABOUT DYING?

21. At Captain Russell's memorial by the river, Dutch spoke, "it is never easy to say farewell to a friend. It is harder yet when the farewell is forever. The worth of a man is said to be counted in the hearts of those he leaves behind. The best men are those who unselfishly defend the defenseless, and champion the causes they feel are just." It is easy to go along with the crowd and let life happen to you; never standing for anything, thus never being in conflict with anyone. To defend something means you have chosen sides; to have made a determination as to the right or wrong of an issue. To defend something means you have made a stand. The cause of Jesus is one thing truly worth standing for. By making a public profession of your faith you are accepting the responsibility to not only defend but go on the offense. When the time comes for testimonials, will it be said you were full of the Spirit, and lead others into battle for the souls of men? That you placed His flag at the top of the mount, and held that ground against all who would defame the name of the Lord Almighty?

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#### ARE APPEARANCES ALWAYS DECEIVING?

22. After their good showing at the games, the new Elite of Boochell entered their new home city; most for the first time. Dutch and Phillip were sitting atop a wagon when Dutch suggested Phillip should be waving to the crowd taking credit for all that had happened. "Phillip wrinkled his nose, 'I did nothing in this but what appeared to be right.' Dutch chuckled, 'My friend if every man did what appeared to be right there would be much love and understanding and much less war in the world." Many times what is right is not a hidden secret, not covered in a mist, and not hard to determine. It is what is obviously right! People struggle with all sorts of social pressures and coercions that make them act in ways they know are wrong. Don't think peer-pressure is just for young people. Social drinking, dirty stories, one-ups-man ship, gossip, foul language, bragging, bullying, revenge, and many more are actions known to be wrong, but are done because we think others may label us as weak or afraid if we don't go along. It will take years of reading the Scripture and living in a close relationship with the Holy Spirit for you to gain control of your flesh. But, you can begin that journey without doing what you know now is wrong.

#### CAN YOU SEE THE ENEMY?

23. On their way to the Willow River Delta, Sterling, Daniel, and Phillip were shot at with arrows. Sometime later Sterling commented on the action. "'An arrow is a quiet killer and when used in ambush has no honor.' It was obvious to his companions that the mighty Sterling was uncomfortable with the idea of fighting an adversary who did not have to stand before him to do battle." Although most of the spiritual battles you wage in life will be with your own evil nature, there is an outward enemy as well. Satan is real and he is all about in the world in which you live. He is not omniscient (all knowing). He is not omnipotent (all powerful). And, he is not omnipresent (everywhere at once). He is powerful, but is no match for the name of Jesus. You need to know he and his legions exist, but do not fear them. "He who is in us is greater than he who is in the world." Though you may not see the enemy, you can do battle with them—if God so calls you to do battle—using the power of the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This is a promise that comes from Jesus, and you can stake your life on it (many have). Sharpen your sword with the study of the Scripture and say what is right and appropriate. Carry your armor proudly and with loving kindness stand for your king.

The Prince started to recall these missing actions, but Sterling's quick glance reminded the younger man that there are things of life and lust you don't discuss in the presence of a lady." One of the victims of the feminine revolution was the respect that was once paid to women, specifically to ladies. In an attempt to gain more "freedom" (their word, not mine), women insisted they be treated as equals not just in pay scale and employment opportunities, but socially as well. What unfortunately happened was that men stepped back and gave women what they thought they wanted. To do this, real men had to set aside the natural instincts to protect and defend. The fallout is confusion in the role of men and women. Women now ask, "Where are the real men?" and men ask "Where are the real women?" What is needed is for Christian men to return to having the respect due to women without the dominance. And women need to allow men to provide for them with understanding and devotion. Meeting in the middle, and understanding the needs of each, will help return society to some sort of balance.

Never had Phillip in all his years of riding truly appreciated the ability of the Barken bred horses. The slightest slip or stumble would be the end. The mist began to catch them. They all knew it was the air being forced ahead of the water ... the rhythm of the horses became one; the excitement overpowered them all. Daniel placed his head down beside the neck of the wonderful horse on which he felt so privileged to ride. ... He did not want to think about the water. ... 'Run, big fellow! Run!' he said softly." We find ourselves occasionally in places or in encounters where we don't belong. It may be something we've caused, or situations out of our control. Nonetheless, we have to deal with the unpleasantness. It is on these occasions that our inherited gifts of the Spirit play the most desirous and obvious role. Sometimes, the Spirit tells us we should avoid confrontation; to run with all our might. Other times we are lead to plant our feet firmly in His will and stand strong for what is right. It always means we accept responsibility for whatever actions result in the situation, but how God wants us to handle it may be different than we expect. Whatever He asks of you He will provide the ability for you to accomplish. For instance, while hanging out with a friend you find yourself in a nightclub, and realize this place is not where you should be. It may be a time to risk your friendship, excuse yourself, and leave. Or, another time while in the break-room, you become aware that some of your fellow workers are going to play a harmful trick on another worker. It may be time for you to intervene. In these types of situations, you may feel there is too much at risk. But when can you ever justify placing what you know is right on the altar of your comfort and popularity? God will always give you a ride out of the circumstances. Whether a horse or strength of character He will provide.

His nature controls and enslaves him from birth. Man's only hope for controlling his evil nature is through the power of the Holy Spirit. Man, left to his own devices, will turn to a depraved, selfish, and sinister nature. He must be taught and tutored in wholesome living. But, even then he has no power over his nature without the power that comes from a gracious heavenly Father.

There is an old axiom; People remember you most by how you make them feel. When you think of yourself as better than anyone else, you are not only hurting yourself, but you are damaging the Kingdom of God. When you disparage or belittle others, your opportunity to do anything else vanishes. God's people should build up and encourage. They should love and empower others in His name.

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# WELL, WHAT DO YOU KNOW?

33. Dutch needed help to do what was necessary to help King Phillip find his way out of the darkness. When the time came, in the King's chamber Dutch spoke to Landra, "'You must let us do what we must to save your father from the darkness.'" She thanked him then turned and spoke to Banyon. "Do with your

When you worry you are saying that whatever it is you are worried about is bigger than God and beyond His control. The only thing that limits God is you.

# DO YOU HEDGE YOUR BETS?

35. While on an outing, Landra and the Elite were surprised by a group of Mobedites. As Sill and the Princess were racing away on their horses, one of the men in black caught up with them. He struck at Landra with his sword. "A ring of steel on steel could be heard as Sil swung his blade back to parry the strike. Sill ...leaped from his own horse onto the back of Landra's and into the face of the pursuer. The black horse stumbled and the pile of horse and humans impacted the ground in a cloud of dust. ... Sill stood up, lifted his sword, and plunged it into the dark figure who lay near him. He then did the same to the dying horse." We are often less afraid of commitments when we provide ourselves with a plan of escape, a way out. Rarely are we sold onto something to the point of total commitment, one hundred percent, withholding nothing. More often we carefully agree to things making sure we can back out of the agreement if it becomes too demanding. Some people even approach God with that same "Plan B" attitude. "I will try it and see if I like it. If not I will try something else." A part-time Christian is a dangerous person not only to the Kingdom of God, but to himself as well. He/she is still allowing partial control to their own evil nature they are truly conflicted. The power to control that very nature is only provided when a person commits their heart to the Lord of all Creation, the giver of love, and the hater of evil. Never underestimate what He is able to do through you when you hold nothing back. Like Sill, you know the risks, you accept the consequences, and you take the leap.

The joy that comes from knowing you are truly free goes beyond simply feeling good and enters the realm of the supernatural. When you truly <u>understand</u> what you have been freed from, and who accomplished such a task, you throw your head back reach up with both hands and cry out loud "Thank you God, thank you Jesus! Praise your name, I <u>am</u> free!"

His feelings of love for her were not only flesh, but born of Spirit. He would never forget that feeling or that kiss." The feeling between a man and woman who are both saved is truly wonderful. If they each are in His will, and working to bring Him glory there is a powerful sense of completeness that comes to their relationship. And, coming to his throne together just feels right!

But, willingness to persist in obedience in spite of trials brings God much pleasure.
